

finlandia Foundation National (FFN) is the most important private source of support for Finnish and Finnish-American culture in the United States.

We were founded in 1953 in Pasadena, California by nine Finnish-Americans who wanted to encourage preservation of homeland traditions in the U.S. and "unite all Finland Friends in this country."

FN was established as a non-profit, philanthropic organization to support cultural and educational programs, cultivate closer relations between Finland and the U.S., and strengthen the bonds of friendship among Finnish-Americans and others interested in our culture and heritage, and in contemporary Finland.

Finlandia Foundation is a cultural handshake across the sea and a living memorial in America. We provide grants, scholarships and programs designed to enrich the Finnish-American experience. Our membership is open to all friends of Finland.

ABoard of Trustees administers FFN programs. Trustees serve three-year terms and the board meets twice yearly to conduct FFN business.

We invite you to join our members through one of the 58 chapters in 25 states and Washington, D.C., or ask your local Finnish-American organization to become affiliated with Finlandia Foundation National.

Membership support helps FFN fulfill its mission through a variety of programs including:

- Performer of the Year and Lecturer of the Year, which present artists and experts on topics of interest to Finnish America at FFN chapters and events across the U.S.
- Academic scholarships for students and law students in the U.S. and Finland
- Grants for cultural projects related to Finland and Finnish America
- Soiva International Music Camp, a unique summer program at Concordia College in Moorhead, Minnesota for instrumental students from the U.S. and Finland
- Funds for young people attending Salolampi Language Village in Minnesota, where they can learn the Finnish language, culture and history in an authentic Finnish setting

Each member receives the FFN newsletter and a copy of the FFN history book, Black Ties and

Miners' Boots: Inventing Finnish-American Philanthropy by Jon L. Saari. FFN reference materials and lending library are available to members.

Chapters identify their affiliation with the national organization through use of the logo and name, and gain visibility through the FFN website, Facebook page and print and e-newsletters.

In addition to its annual activities, FFN participates in special programs of interest to Finnish America. FFN and its chapters celebrated the 150th anniversary of the birth of Finnish composer Jean Sibelius with a variety of events across the U.S. in 2015, and the centennial of Finland's independence with a series of programs throughout 2017.

FN administers nearly two dozen funds that support grants and scholarships in a wide range of areas such as music, visual and performing arts, sports, heritage and youth programs, and academics, including legal studies.

Our administrative expenses and matching funds are generously supported by grants from the Paloheimo Foundation. As a 501(c)(3) organization, contributions to FFN are tax deductible. Gifts may be made as unrestricted donations or directed to specific programs.
